Expectations

- Spend unhurried time with God everyday
- Actively be part of a small group
- Lead the way in respecting authority
- Refrain from gossip and judgment toward others
- Maintain appropriate boundaries and behavior with the opposite sex
- Serve with a high standard of excellence and professionalism
- Know when you are scheduled and be on time
- Communicate well in advance if you cannot keep your serving commitment

Responsibilities

- Exalt the name of Jesus by word and deed
- Follow the directions of the Student Staff and/or Team Leaders
- Commit to developing a heart of service (As leaders, we should be the first people to step-up and serve no matter the situation; always be on the lookout for things to help with)

Dress Code

As leaders, how we present ourselves sends a message to everyone around us. We should always be mindful of who we are representing and what we are communicating to others in how we dress.

> We live in such a way that no one will stumble because of us, and no one will find fault with our ministry. 2 Corinthians 6:3

- Short shorts, short skirts, and short dresses are prohibited. The only exception is if you are wearing leggings underneath. (Tights and hose are *not* considered leggings)
- Keep your undergarments *under* your clothing at all times
- Strapless tops, crop tops, and low-cut bro tanks are prohibited
- Inappropriate or offensive slogans, messages, or symbols on clothing or belongings is prohibited
- Our role as leaders is more important than our outfits. If we're unsure of the appropriateness of our clothing, let's choose not to wear it.

Discipline

Serving in ministry is a privilege, and that privilege comes with certain responsibilities. When we are assigned a task, others in the ministry are counting on us to carry it out with heart, excellence, and in a timely manner. If we fail to carry out our responsibilities, other people are forced to pick-up the slack. As such, complete cooperation is necessary to be part of a serving team.

Obey your spiritual leaders, and do what they say. Their work is to watch over your souls, and they are accountable to God. Give them reason to do this with joy and not with sorrow. That would certainly not be for your benefit. Hebrews 13:17

- If for any reason it is decided that you cannot serve under the leadership in place in your ministry, you may be asked to step down.
- If you arrive to service having chosen not to respect the dress code, you will forfeit the opportunity to serve that day. If you continue to choose not to adhere to the dress code, the WESM Staff will discuss options with you and/or your parents and you may be asked to step down.
- If you fail to notify your coach in a reasonable amount of time that you cannot serve on a pre-scheduled day, you may be suspended from the schedule by the ministry leader. If you are already scheduled during the suspension period, you will be rescheduled accordingly.
